5. PLANNING

We have had quite a few plans submitted this year, most of them were residential alterations. The other main ones

Were: -

Coop store on West Street, no objection second time around and passed by NLC.

Messingham Quarry extension, objected on grounds of no TMP, passed by NLC.

5 dwellings on Sturton Nurseries were objected to on grounds it was outside the building line but was passed by N.L.C.

6. FINANCE.

Finance has gone well this year; we have carried out many projects around the Parish. We have a surplus of about £16000, which is about on par with last years. Accounts will be auditored by an external company in the next few months.

Flowerbed sponsorship has gone well again.

Continuous Income from Football Teams.

Demeter House now rent the Playing Fields during term time.

Donations were given to-: Scawby Rainbows, Horticultural Society, Police Band.

Grants obtained from NLC and Grantscape/Brigg Power Station.

The rest of the PC expenses and income are as per financial statement.

7. POLICE MATTERS

Due to vehicle speeds around the village we have had the following carried out: -

Vehicle speed checks have taken place on various places around the Parish.

We have also had erected speed awareness signs. These are the digital type that indicates actual speed.

Attack on a person in the public house car park.

Numerous village crimes have been reported including house break ins and theft from farms. Please be vigilant!!!

Church windows broken.

Meeting with the Humberside Crime and Police Commissioner.

8. NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL HIGHWAYS MATTERS

Potholes have again been appearing around the village, most are repaired after NLC have been informed. Certain roads and paths have been re-surfaced.

Various footpaths require repairing, overhanging trees cutting back, some have been completed but many are still outstanding.

Discussions have taken place with NLC about restricting HGV travelling through the Village, this has not been successful after many hours of meetings.

Fly tipping is still happening around the Parish.

Finally the entrances to Ermine Street/Bluebell Woods etc where finally completed after many failed attempts.

Most of Scawby parish has had their street lighting changed to LED.

NLC agreed to carry out work down Silversides Lane to tidy up the area.

Still no outcome regarding the grass verges in Scawby Brook.

Meetings regarding Straw and noise in Scawby Brook from BNLL.

Demeter House School have now leased the Grove from NLC.

Ornamental verge system still in operation in Sturton and Scawby Village.

Drains blocked on Church Street – Gully sucker cleaning carried out.

All problems around the Parish now have to be notified through the Portal at NLC, no other method that can be used.

9. PLAYING FIELD AND VILLAGE MATTERS.

Xmas light switch on was a success again, thanks to the Village Hall and Scawby Events Team for assisting, also Jim Brown and the Nelthorpe Estate for providing tree.

Litter pick around Scawby and Scawby Brook was a success.

More Play Equipment has been updated with help from Brigg Power Station grants, its nice to see the play area being used by many families now the nice weather has arrived.

Front Garden competition was held again with the winners being announced at the Horticultural Show.

Scawby parish have agreed to be part of a pilot scheme to control all of the grass cutting in the Parish.

Tree planting scheme is under review for the Parish.

Scawby was joint second in the Large Village in Bloom contest. Due to chafer grubs and very dry summer we did not get the best out of our planting scheme.

Dog fouling has been particularly bad around the parish. Notices have been put in the Parish magazine. Also we have had new dog placed in strategic positions around the Parish.

Tommy the silhouette came to Scawby in October to commemorate 100 years of World War 1.

New flowerbed at the corner of Church Street.

We have had new benches sculptured by Alan Stickler placed around the village.

10. OTHER ITEMS

Remembrance service was held at the Parish Church. A buffet reception was held after in the Village Hall, this was very successful and hopefully we will do the same this year.
