**IT WAS RESOLVED to OBJECT** to this application as the proposed wall/fence line to the front boundary of the property(immediately onto the pavement) is higher than the recommended 1m in height and the proposed gate to this front entrance is of a solid nature, both these factors inhibit clear vision of pedestrians/vehicles when entering and exiting this property. This objection is concerned with highway safety.

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- b) Application PA/2026/555 – Planning permission to vary condition 2 of PA/2019/1393 with previous amendments under PA/2024/1439 and PA/2025/893, namely to amend design of dwelling on plot 5, with the addition of front porch and small rear extension and additional works – Sturton Nurseries, Main Street, Sturton.

## **11. NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL HIGHWAYS MATTERS**

- i. To receive reports from Broughton & Scawby Ward Councillors: Cllr Lee advised that the meeting at the playing fields with N.L.C Leader R Waltham and Ward Councillors and parish council representatives took place and a photograph taken to confirm the community grant funding for the new play equipment. Unfortunately the traffic lights planned for Broughton/Scawby crossroads have been delayed to the autumn due to the need to relocate underground services. Anglian Water are working in Lidgetts Close this week. A fence has been erected to try and curtail fly tipping in the layby on the A18 and a litter collection has taken place on Mortal Ash hill where 19.5T of rubbish was collected. Residents whose central heating is oil have benefitted from the £300 contribution from N.L.C. This has been very much appreciated by residents.
- ii. Scawby Brook matters – No further updates.
- iii. Review of action list: Unfortunately one cycle track sign at the playing fields was damaged but has been immediately repaired. Pot hole repairs are still outstanding on St Hybalds.
- iv. New highways matters – The school sports day is planned for 10/7/26 – unfortunately the village hall is in use all day therefore the village hall car park will not be available for parents/visitors to the school sports day. The school has been advised.

**12. PLAYING FIELD AND VILLAGE MATTERS**

**i. Planting Group:**

- a) Any new planting matters to consider and agree – Some stakes have been removed/damaged from the trees in the plantation at the bottom of the playing fields. The response from the Merlin community fund is expected this month. The summer bedding plants were put in this week, unfortunately 2 fern plants have been stolen from Messingham lane, these have been replaced. The co-op garden continues to be tended on a regular basis, more time on this bed may be required throughout the growing season.

**Playing Field Committee:**

- a) **Playground Equipment and Works** – Work has been undertaken to the paths, pavilion soffits, gutters, air vent stone, door frame and some slabs laid – the concreting will take place this Friday. New swing seats have been fitted, the cross trainer repaired, steering wheel fitted and parts for the zip wire purchased to make necessary repairs. A discussion took place regarding the Witches Hat – it has been removed as repairs are needed and a decision has to be made to repair, replace or permanently remove. It was noted that it is a very popular piece of equipment. Two new benches have been purchased and fitted at the playing pitches, a donation from N Johnson has been received for these benches. Plaques will be fitted to the benches and gratitude was expressed to N Johnson and the football teams for their generosity. Cllr's Powell and Frost met with the N.L.C playground inspectors and had a very informative meeting and the parish council will continue to liaise with these inspectors to ensure all safety matters at the playground are adhered to. The defibrillator has been serviced and tested and the fire extinguishers will be tested on 10/6/26.

- ii) **Parish Council website** – The new website is ready to go live – the gov.uk emails for parish councillors need arranging (clerk) and a meeting with the website company, Cllr's Powell and Griffiths and the clerk will be arranged to manage the editing of the new website.

The clerk had previously circulated the quotation from A Sissons for this work.  
It was agreed that A Sissons would commence the weed killing programme around the whole of the village ( within the 30mph zone) with a quotation received of £1,044.
